# What are the origins of Valentine's Day?


While some believe that Valentine's Day commemorates the anniversary of Valentine's death or burial—which probably occurred around A.D. 270— others claim that the Christian church may have decided to place St. Valentine's feast day in the middle of February in an effort to "Christianize" the pagan celebration of Lupercalia. Celebrated at the Ides of February, or February 15, Lupercalia was a fertility festival dedicated to Faunus, the Roman god of agriculture, as well as to the Roman founders Romulus and Remus.

To begin the festival, members of the Luperci, an order of Roman priests, would gather at a sacred cave where the infants Romulus and Remus, were believed to have been cared for by a she-wolf or lupa. A ceremonial sacrifice, and celebration would ensue—ending with the young women placing their names in a big urn. The bachelors would choose a name, and become paired for the year with that woman.

Lupercalia survived the rise of Christianity but was outlawed—as it was deemed "un-Christian"—at the end of the 5th century, when Pope Gelasius declared February 14, St. Valentine's Day. It was not until much later, however, that the day became definitively associated with love. During the Middle Ages, it was commonly believed in France and England that the day began birds' mating season. The English poet Geoffrey Chaucer was the first to record St. Valentine's Day as a day of romantic celebration in his 1375 poem "Parliament of Foules," writing, ""For this was sent on Seynt Valentyne's day / Whan every foul cometh ther to choose his mate."
